The MHA program is designed to equip individuals for pivotal administrative roles, guiding them to executive positions within complex health organizations. The curriculum is rigorously designed to focus on both strategic and operational management, thus orienting students toward the broad spectrum of managerial challenges and functions likely to be encountered by health organizations.

The degree combines coursework with applied experiences, equipping students with essential skills in:

- Measuring the quality of care in health facilities
- Budget funding and financial management
- Information management
- Research and data analytics
- Operational Management

The Master in Health Administration program will enhance graduates with the necessary organizational and leadership skills needed to effectively manage and shape health care organizations.

All courses are accelerated, allowing full-time track students to complete the program in 24-27 months.
